How's Messy Church doing? Well, in many ways the answer has to be 'Very well, thank you!' Each month 20-30 adults and children come and enjoy learning about the Christian faith through bible stories, craft activities, games and conversations with the Messy Church helpers. A 15-minute Celebration in the church brings everything together in the message for the day with a lot of participation from everyone and a relevant song and a prayer. A delicious tea gives us all time to chat and get to know each other.

Some families are familiar to us from our morning services and King's Kids, for others Messy Church has become their church. We're told that some of the children can hardly wait to get there. This is now a well-established mainstream part of life at St Paul's and an important means of bringing the Christian message to the community.

There is of course a BUT coming. Our helpers are very dedicated and really do gain a lot from the sessions BUT we are all 'people of a certain age' who find Messy Church days very tiring, however great the enjoyment and satisfaction. The problem comes after the morning service with setting up chairs and tables in the Canteen for tea and in the Hall for the activities, then taking them all down, putting them away and sweeping up at the end of the afternoon.

We really do need some help; a few pairs of younger hands once a month for a few minutes after the morning service to set up tables and chairs and a couple of people coming along at around 4:45 to help with the clearing up (you could come a bit earlier for a cuppa, sandwiches, cake and jelly and ice cream!).
