From our Minister

Are you finding this lockdown tough? I certainly am – tougher than the first one, and mainly because it's Winter this time. The weather is cold and damp, the nights are long. We can't go out except for shopping or exercise, and people are getting into trouble for travelling unnecessarily. Now is the Winter of our discontent, and it is proving challenging.

I appreciate that January has been another month of challenge and anxiety for many people in our church. But for all of us it is the sheer monotony of trudging along day to day that is exacting its toll upon us. We feel like exiles in our own land, longing for deliverance. The pressures of working from home (for those able to do so) along with the responsibility for home schooling and childcare are sometimes almost too much to bear. It feels like we are squashed together in a domestic pressure cooker, unable to let off steam. There are others amongst us who live alone, and the solitude is really getting to us now. The road is long and seems to be getting longer.

Yet there is hope on the horizon – we just can't get an accurate grasp of where the horizon lies. I am hearing of more and more people from my churches who are receiving their first Covid vaccination, which is a cause for joy and I'm sure brings a great sense of relief to the recipients. Let us keep praying for the vaccination programme, this astonishing achievement that is being rolled out in our country. Mistakes may have been made along the way over how the pandemic has been handled, but as Christians let us focus not on the negatives but on the positives. Let's not waste our time by giving in to the desire to point the finger and accuse (this is the work of Satan). Let us instead celebrate the victories, small though they may be. Let us not grow so weary of following the rules that we decide to flaunt them and do as we like. Admit it, sometimes we enjoy the feeling of schadenfreude which we get from hearing about people being handed penalty notices for breaking lockdown regulations.

Instead, let us follow the example of scripture:

"Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things". (Philippians 4:8)

Matt Hancock expressed that "vaccination is our route out of this". He's right: but so also are the eternal gifts of God, expressed in 1 Corinthians 13:13. "These three remain – faith hope and love". Let's make sure that we stand strong on these for our deliverance.

Lord Jesus,



Daphne's Marmalade Cake

If you miss popping into Loaves and Fishes for a chat with friends over a morning cuppa and a slice of one of Daphne's wonderful cakes, here's one of her recipes you can bake yourself.

How about enjoying a slice while you do the Big Garden Birdwatch?

Set oven to gas mark 4, 350F, 180C, Fan 160

Ingredients

6oz soft margarine or butter

5oz caster sugar

8oz self-raising flour (sieved)

1 tablespoon thick cut marmalade

3 medium eggs

Topping

1 tablespoon warmed marmalade

Grease and flour an 8" cake tin.

Cream margarine and sugar together.

Add eggs and flour. Mix well.

Add marmalade. Mix again.

Place in prepared tin. Put in oven one shelf below middle.

Cook for 45 minutes then check to see if done.

When done, leave in tin for 10 minutes, turn out onto cooling rack and brush warmed marmalade over top. Leave to cool.

Eat and enjoy!
